This partnership led to designing of the 12 Steps of Recovery and the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous, which changed how the public perceived alcoholism, reduced stigmatization, and advocated a disease concept. 


Empire Recovery Center: Judi, the Facility Coordinator is looking to rotate out of this position. She could also use help on the 3rd Wednesday.

Soon he reconnected with his home group and started doing service, which got him out of his dark rut and back on track.

Rise in Pandemic-Era Drinking Continues (from June 2025 issue of the Grapevine)

Alcohol use increased during the COVID-19 pandemic and remained elevated even after the pandemic ended, according to a recent study. From 2018 to the height of the pandemic in 2020, heavy alcohol use among Americans rose by 20%. In 2022, the increases were sustained.


The rise in drinking was seen across all age groups, genders, races, ethnicities and regions of the country, except for Native Americans and Asian Americans. Adults ages 40-49 had the highest increase in heavy alcohol use.

"These numbers reflect an alarming public health issue," said Brian P. Lee, MD, a liver-transplant specialist and lead investigator of the study. He hopes the study will drive medical screenings. "We encourage health care providers to offer more interventions for at-risk populations," he said. (Source: Annals of Internal Medicine, November 2024)
