February Step, Tradition & Concept Checklists

Step Two: Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity

1. How might a Power truly greater than myself restore me to sanity?
2. Am I open minded enough to allow others to find their own Higher Power?
3. Where have I become reliant upon a Power greater than myself or do I still exhibit defiance?
4. When do I have reservations about the insanity of my drinking?

Tradition Two - For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.

1. Do I criticize or do I trust and support my group officers, AA committees and office workers? Newcomers? Old-timers?
2. Am I absolutely trustworthy, even in secret, with AA Twelfth Step jobs or other AA responsibilities?
3. Do I look for credit in my AA jobs, praise for my AA ideas?
4. Do I often feel the need to “save face” in group discussions, or can I yield in good spirit to the group conscience and work along with it?
5. Although I have been sober a few years, am I still willing to serve my turn with AA chores?
6. Do I complain about the decisions that my group makes, even though I do not attend the business meetings where these decisions are made?

Concept Two: The General Service Conference of A.A. has become, for nearly every practical purpose, the active voice and the effective conscience of our whole Society in its world affairs.

1. Do we have an understanding of the history of the General Service Conference (the “Conference”)?
2. What is a Conference Advisory Action? Does our home group’s GSR, DCM, area delegate report back to the group on the highlights of the Conference and Conference Advisory Actions?
3. Is our group meeting its wider Seventh Tradition responsibilities?

H&I ANNUAL PINK CAN REPORT TO THE FELLOWSHIP – FYE 2025

The Hospital & Institution Committee of Northern California is a Ninth Tradition service committee of Alcoholics Anonymous with the purpose of carrying the message of A.A. to those who are confined in prisons, hospitals, treatment facilities, and other institutions. NorCal H&I has been carrying the A.A. message of recovery to confined alcoholics dating to its origins in 1942 at San Quentin State Prison and is one of the oldest Ninth Tradition service committees of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Northern California H&I supports more than 27,400 meetings *each year*, serving approximately 20 major state and federal institutions plus hundreds of local jails, hospitals, rehabs, and other community facilities. Unlike in most areas of the country, the NorCal H&I Committee incorporates service to both treatment AND corrections facilities, allowing a simple path for volunteers to move through different service commitments, as well as the ability to distribute our resources across the spectrum of facilities and institutions for confined alcoholics. Additionally, we make sponsorship services available to hundreds of inmates confined in state prisons.

Those who are confined often don't have the resources to buy AA literature, so the Pink Can, with your contributions, covers this cost. Unlike other areas of the country which don't have separately funded H&I committees, in Northern CA the use of the Pink Cans allows us to purchase literature necessary to our service without placing the burden of this expense on the local groups, Central Office, or General Service Committees.

In the period ending December 2025 NorCal H&I incurred \$539,712.18 of literature expenses for the use of the alcoholic who is confined. Despite lingering shutdowns, we were still able to distribute literature, including AAWS books, Grapevine / LaViña magazines and books, and meeting schedules to our facilities. These essential categories comprise 87.7% of NorCal H&I's total 2025 expenses; 5% of our expenses is allocated to help the Areas in performing the work of our committee while the remaining 7.3% covers our operating costs. Additionally, we pay for neither an office nor for salaries for service committee workers, thus enabling us to dedicate such a large portion of our contributions to literature for the confined alcoholic. We publish our Financial Report online monthly in order to be accountable to our Fellowship for these and all other expenses.

The Northern California Hospital & Institution Committee has for many years been one of the largest purchasers of literature from AAWS, contributing significantly to the support of our General Service Office in New York. No H&I members are ever paid for their Twelfth Step service, nor are they reimbursed for expenses incurred carrying the message into these institutions, regardless of the distance. Some H&I volunteers drive well over 200 miles for a weekly or monthly institution meeting - these travel expenses are a personal contribution of the individual.

The H&I Committee is adamant that the contributions so generously made to our Pink Cans in no way detract from the Seventh Tradition collections of the groups. We therefore ask that the Pink Cans be passed separately from and after the baskets to avoid subtracting from support of the Seventh Tradition, and we encourage all members to remove the cans from the baskets if they are being passed together. Many groups have had success in passing the collections at different times, for example passing the basket at the regular time and passing the Pink Cans at the end of the meetings. We are humbly grateful for the generous contributions, both financial and in service, of the AA members of Northern CA who make our mission possible, and especially for the cooperation of our fellow service committees throughout the area. **Without this loving support, tens of thousands of confined alcoholics simply would not have access to the lifesaving message of A.A.**

A Love Like This

This beautiful four-letter word was once just drunk talk. Now it's deep, real and true.

What is love? Well, let's explore ... I can remember well the drunken 3 a.m. phone calls to I don't remember who, professing that I was madly in love. I also remember waking up with a hangover with someone I didn't know, when the night before I could swear we were going to be together forever. I remember being in a relationship, giving Valentine's cards professing my undying love, while hiding beer cans under the driver's seat of my car. But I really, really loved her—really!

Wow, I do not miss those days at all. Thank goodness for AA. It's here in the rooms of AA where I finally experienced a love I had never known before. The way sponsors have given me patience, kindness and compassion. The way they listen to my challenges. The way I can walk into a meeting anywhere in the world and be accepted for who I am, just by being an alcoholic. Now *that's* love.

I can always find what I need in this program, no matter what. One time in early sobriety I needed to move across town, but I was low on cash. My sponsor suggested I make a non-AA related announcement stating how I needed help. Right after the meeting a member came up to me and said, "I have a truck and a trailer, where do you need me and what time?" Then a woman gave my sponsor permission to use her big truck. That very day a troop of AAs loaded all my stuff and got me moved! I offered what cash I could give, and they wouldn't accept it. "Pay it forward," they all said. I still get tears in my eyes when I think of it. Now this is love.

A few months ago, I was having a rough time mentally. The reality I was carrying fell from beneath me. I felt like I had no foundation. I went out to my truck and decided I was going to drive to the mental hospital and admit myself. Instead, I called an AA friend and said, "I just want you to know, I am going to go check myself into the mental hospital." She said, "Honey, why don't you drive over here to my house first, can you do that? I said, "OK." I then called another AA friend and stayed on the phone until I made it to my friend's house. I didn't want to stop at a store and buy alcohol. I was afraid I was going to "lose it."

My friend greeted me at the door, and I literally melted into her hug and started sobbing. It's rare that I let someone see this side of me. I regained enough composure to walk over to her kitchen table. We spent the next two hours there having coffee and talking. I felt my reality return. The foundation beneath me formed again. My friend reminded me that I was OK. Talking with her helped show me a new way of seeing things. She listened, I listened, and after a while I was back on solid ground. I could stand strong again.

This was the Fellowship of AA—"We can do together what we can't do alone." We gave each other compassion, grace, understanding, and yes, a thread of patience. Once again, this program saved my life, even after I had some years of sobriety under my belt. Yes, this is love.

May this Valentine's Day and every day help us practice a love just like this. What a great day to be sober.


